

## How to Turn the Parents' Bill of Rights into Law

Here's what you can do:

1. Mail the Parents' Bill of Rights to your Members of Congress and state legislators. Ask them to enact it into law. (To find the names and contact information of your elected officials, go to: <http://www.vote-smart.org/index.phtml>).
2. Give copies of the Parents' Bill of Rights to your friends, neighbors, and relatives. Ask them to send copies to their Members of Congress and state legislators. (Copies of the Parents' Bill of Rights are available at <http://www.commercialalert.org/pbor.pdf>).
3. Set up meetings with your Members of Congress and state legislators and ask them to turn the Parents' Bill of Rights into law.
4. Put copies of the Parents' Bill of Rights in day care centers, schools, churches, synagogues, coffee shops, grocery stores and other places where parents gather.
5. Encourage local civic, community and parents' groups to endorse the Parents' Bill of Rights and to support it. Please call Commercial Alert at 503.235.8012 about any endorsement of the Parents Bill of Rights.
6. Write letters to the editor or op-eds for your local newspapers in support of the Parents' Bill of Rights.
